Can my child come to school with nits or lice?

Head lice can infect anyone and it often spreads through the community. Parents are encouraged to check hair regularly and if necessary treat their child's hair.

Parents will be contacted immediately if lice or nits are detected and a general advice notice will be distributed to all students in the class.

Students can return to school when hair has been treated and all nits and lice have been removed.

How do I send money to school?

Money being sent to school should be put in a well sealed envelope, clearly marked with the purpose, the child's name, year level and amount you have enclosed. Usually a school payment envelope will be sent home with notes that ask for payment to be made. Students must hand money straight to their classroom teacher at the start of the day. Payments are taken to the office for receipting and banking.

Is there a canteen?

The school does not run a canteen so students must come to school each day with their recess snack, lunch, and a piece of fruit or vegetable to eat during crunch and sip time.

If it is necessary for food to be dropped off at school, it can be brought to the office and will be delivered at recess or lunch.

We promote healthy eating to align with Healthy Food and Drink Guidelines and our Healthy Food & Drink Policy; food and drink consumed at school should be in line with this.

Each term the P & C will organise a healthy meal deal for lunch to raise funds for the school.

Who can give medication to my child?

School staff are able to assist those students with medication needs at school. Parents are advised that Department of Education guidelines state all such requests must be made to the school in writing. The medication must be given to the office staff by a parent/ carer and DoE paperwork needs to be completed stating medication, dose and time to be administered then signed. Medication must be placed in the care of the office staff. If these guidelines are not adhered to, medication will not be administered.



Can I be a parent helper?

Teachers appreciate offers of help within the classroom and students enjoy having parents as part of their school day. Parents can help with small groups, literacy, numeracy, craft, sport etc. You may also have a skill you are happy to impart to the students.

Teachers, especially in junior primary, will often put up a parent help roster for you to fill out.

Please support your school and classroom teacher by volunteering your valuable time if you are able.



Can my child bring toys to school?

Students are discouraged from bringing any toys or valuables to school and the school accepts no responsibility for valuable items brought to school and left in bags. This includes but is not limited to mobile phones, tablets, iPods, jewellery, expensive games or other electronic devices. This eliminates the upset and heartache caused by lost, broken or stolen items. We ask that parents support this and do not allow their children to bring such items to school.

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS

Funds from parent contributions are used to purchase student resources such as student workbooks, art supplies, sports equipment, library resources and technologies.

COMMUNICATION

Seesaw is the main communication platform used by staff at KPS. You can download the **Seesaw** app for free. QR codes for connecting are

provided by teachers at the beginning of each school year.



Reminders and absentee notifications are sent out via SMS .

Two way communication is essential and we encourage parents to contact the school with any <u>questions</u>, <u>grievances</u>, <u>concerns</u> or <u>information</u> to share.

ASSEMBLY

Assemblies are held three times a term in weeks three, six and nine at 9.00am on a Friday in the undercover area.



BIKES

A bike rack is available and students are encouraged to use a lock. Bikes <u>must</u> be walked when on school grounds and when crossing the road.



PARKING

For safety reasons, staff car parks **must not** be used for student drop off or pick up.



SITE REQUIREMENTS

Visitors are welcome to the school at any time, however, entry must be through the office at the front of the school and the register <u>must</u> be signed on arrival; this includes parents. This is a security measure in order to ensure we can keep our school a safe place for all our students.

MANAGING STUDENT BEHAVIOUR

Each class develops their own set of classroom rules and expectations and positive reinforcements to encourage appropriate behaviour. Students are provided opportunities to develop appropriate behaviours, self-control and resiliency through interaction with staff, the curriculum and positive reinforcement strategies. Students are taught how to accept responsibility for their own behaviours, and to enhance their understanding of responsible social behaviour.

123 Magic & Emotion Coaching is implemented across the school for managing student behaviour. It is a three tiered system, including the use of warnings, time outs in the classroom and time in the office. More details are outlined in the school's Student Behaviour Policy.
