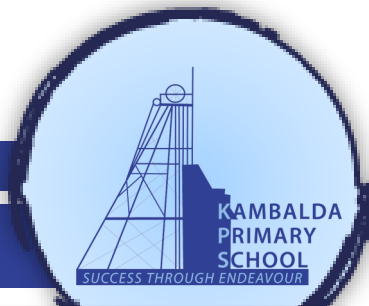

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## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S PEN

What a busy first few weeks we have had this term. I would like to thank and acknowledge the P&C for their organisation and planning of the Mother's Day stall. The stall was set up and made accessible to all students at recess and lunch on specific days during the week and mums gave up their time to run the stall. I hope all mum's appreciated their gifts and had a special day on Mother's Day.

Last Thursday we held our assembly over the PA system with students remaining in their classrooms due to the pupil free day Friday. A huge thank you to Elanor in Room 3 for sharing the Acknowledgement of Country; Room 3 have been creating their own Acknowledgements of Country for the school. I look forward to hearing many more and perhaps selecting one that can be a permanent one for the school. The routine of the assembly was the same with students receiving certificates and awards acknowledged in their classroom. Students who received prizes got them from the office at recess. It ran smoothly and was well supported by teachers and students. Week 6 will see the return of onsite assemblies and I look forward to seeing lots of parents in attendance.

At the assembly students were reminded that school uniform is a requirement and wearing it with pride every day is an expectation. Any students that wear jumpers with hoods are not permitted to wear the hood on school grounds. Teachers are enforcing the dress code and students will be asked to remove their jumpers if they are not close in colour to the school uniform colours. Navy and/or black jumpers and bottoms will be considered acceptable but jumpers with bold colours and writing will not. Parents will be contacted by teachers if required.

The School Improvement and Accountability policy requires us to publish an annual School Report that describes the school's performance. The Report is succinct and prepared with a public audience in mind. Sky blue and navy polo shirt with school emblem

Navy track pants with sky blue piping

Navy jacket with school emblem

Navy fleecy jumper with school emblem (*no hoodies*)

School shoes, joggers or closed in shoes (*no thongs, sandals or slip on shoes*).



### **Faction Polo shirts**

The School factions are

⇒ **Carnilya** (green)

⇒ **Victory** (gold)

⇒ **Otter** (red).

Faction tops are to be worn on Thursdays to earn faction points during daily fitness, and on school carnival days.

### **Jewellery**

Students may wear jewellery limited to a small silver or gold necklace, one ring, a watch, one bracelet and small sleeper or stud earrings.

All other jewellery will be deemed unsuitable for school and will be considered a safety concern for the student or other students.

### **Hats**

Caps or hats are to be worn at all times throughout the school year. Students may borrow a hat from the school office on a needs basis to participate in sport lessons or play in other areas in the playground outside of the undercover area.

**Make-up/Cosmetics** NO student is to wear facial make up.

### **PLEASE NOTE:**

School uniforms are preferred, however, generic navy coloured bottoms (shorts, skorts, pants, leggings and tights) and jumpers; and sky blue polo shirts, are permissible.

Multi coloured and bright coloured clothes should not be worn.
