We want our students to be socially competent, resilient and caring of others.



FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S PEN

Welcome back to Term 4, that will be another busy term with lots of teaching and learning for both staff and students. The Term Planner is going home Friday with all students so I encourage you to put it somewhere that you can refer to it regularly throughout the term to keep ahead of what is happening at Kambalda Primary School for your child/ren.

The weather will start to get hotter over the coming weeks so please continue adhering to the Kambalda Primary School Dress Code ensuring that your child/ren wear closed in shoes that are comfortable and appropriate to play in. Classes participate in sporting sessions throughout the week and Jump Jam or running each Monday to Thursday morning so it is important that shoes are appropriate. Also a reminder to continue sending your child/ren to school in their school uniform and/or the school

coloured shirt and bottoms.

'School uniform and a School Dress Code is designed to ensure that students are safe, provide equity among peers, build and maintain the school team spirit and encourage the neat presentation to foster an empowered, positive self-image'.



Tuesday mornings from 8:30am-10:30am in Week 2 through to Week 7, the Pre Kindy program will be running in the Kindy room with Mrs Ros and Miss Free. This is a program designed to prepare children and parents for Kindergarten, through in-school activities and experiences. It is not too late to enrol for Kindergarten 2023 if you haven't already and participate in the Pre Kindy program; if you know of anyone in the community that has a child that is eligible for Kindergarten in 2023 (born between July 2018 and June 2019) please share this information with them.

Each year, Western Australians use more than 1.3 billion drink containers. Sadly, many are not recycled, ending up in landfill and as litter across our state. Containers for Change, Western Australia's container deposit scheme, will help increase recycling rates and reduce litter. Kambalda Primary School is registered for Containers for Change and we are encouraging all members of our school community and the wider community to donate their containers to either our donation point located near the staff carpark at the school or by nominating our code when dropping off donations to the Containers for Change Refund Point in Kambalda so that the school receives the donation. Our Scheme Code is C10323898.

If you are <u>not</u> returning to Kambalda Primary School in 2023, please let us know so we can plan accurately for next year. *Students currently enrolled in Kindergarten need to complete a new enrolment for Pre Primary as per the Department and school's guidelines*; this paperwork will be sent home in the coming weeks and needs to be returned to the school office at your earliest convenience.

I look forward to working with everybody throughout the term and again appreciate all the support given by families and the wider community to not only myself but to the staff and students of Kambalda Primary School.

healthy at home and at school.






