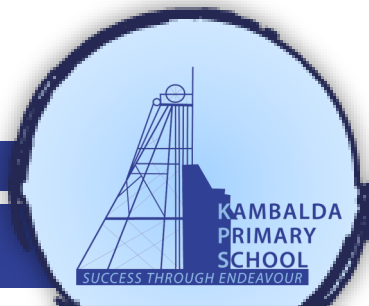

Welcome to KPS in 2023

BEFORE SCHOOL:

Parents are advised not to send their child/ren to school prior to 8:20am. If children arrive before this time they should be directed immediately to the undercover area. Supervision is provided each morning from 8.15– 8.30am. No students are allowed on the playground equipment or in classrooms at any time before school.

The bus arrives at 8:15am and students go straight to the undercover area to be supervised. Staff with children on site must also take or direct them to the undercover area at 8:15am. All teachers collect their class from the undercover area at 8:30am every morning to walk/supervise students to classrooms.

AFTER SCHOOL:

Parents should wait for their child at the Larkin Street crosswalk. Parents are not permitted to use staff car parks to drop off or pick up students or to enter grounds without signing in through the office. (as per School Access Policy)

Pre-primary and Kindergarten

It is not appropriate for older siblings to collect K or PP students unless clearance is obtained from the principal.

To minimize congestion, parents of Pre-primary students are asked to wait inside the school gate at the tree to collect children.

Students (and parents) are to use the cross walk on Larkin Street to and from school.
